Annual Meeting Outcomes: New Knowledge Transferred to Participants and Their Patients




Figure 1. This chart represents topics ranked in categories of interest (5,6,7), on a seven point scale. The last four topics were responses volunteered by respondents, ranked 5,6 or 7, on a seven point scale.

In response to member feedback about the growing interest in the prevention, treatment and management of diabetes (Figure 1), a concomitant disorder of hypertension, ISHIB continues to expand its educational programs with the latest diabetes research. During ISHIB2011, Kwame Osei, MD, chaired the plenary session "Evolving Science and Future Options in Type 2 Diabetes and Disease Management" in Boston, Mass. The program was sponsored by an unrestricted educational grant from Bristol-Myers Squibb.

While satisfaction surveys serve to ensure us that programming is helpful, ISHIB also conducts assessment of pre- and post-program learning. Dr. Osei's program drew a mix of health care professionals, including physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, certified diabetes educators, and students and fellows from the surrounding Boston medical schools.

ISHIB DOC Legs for Life Study Plans for Launch



Since the Diabetes and Obesity Consortium (DOC) Summit Meeting in 2010, ISHIB DOC has moved forward to create a multiyear campaign, modeled after IMPACT and also featuring a toolkit study based on diabetes guidelines and behavioral modification strategies.

ISHIB is proud to announce that Sanofi, who also sponsored the DOC Summit Meeting, will now support the ISHIB DOC "Legs for Life" Toolkit Study (Patient-Centered Diabetes Care Model). The study will take place in Columbus, Ohio, in partnership with Ohio State University and led by ISHIB members Kwame Osei, MD, and Trudy Gaillard, RN, PhD, with consulting support from DOC Co-Chair, James R. Gavin, III, MD.

Planning is underway for the September focus group sessions to determine the DOC toolkit components; enrollment is set to begin in October. Drs. Osei and Gaillard, with extensive experience in Columbus-area community-based projects and clinical studies, hope to have the Legs for Life study fully enrolled and launched before the end of the year.



For example, of the health care professionals attending this year's conference, more than 50% provided medical care for more than 10 patients with diabetes a week, with some caring for as many as 75 patients with diabetes a week.
